

Visit Faiyum, the region developed by Joseph's divinely inspired wisdom, featuring ancient storehouses and a man-made lake created by a canal ordered by Joseph.





Embark on a transformative pilgrimage through Egypt, exploring the profound biblical history and the ancient wonders of the Pharaohs. This 11-day journey offers a deep connection to early Christian stories and the rich cultural heritage of Egypt, providing an unforgettable spiritual and historical experience.

Day 1: Departure to Cairo

Our life-changing journey begins this evening as we board our overnight flight to Cairo, Egypt.

Day 2: Arrival in Cairo

We arrive in the land of the Pharaohs, Jacob, Joseph, and Israel during the famine! Upon arrival at the airport, we meet our guide and are immediately transported into Cairo, the capital of Egypt. We transfer to our hotel to settle in and start soaking up the atmosphere of this exciting city. Dinner and overnight in Cairo.

Day 3: Alexandria

After breakfast, we embark on a day tour to the ancient seaport of Alexandria, where we will see the Greco-Roman culture in Egypt. Known as "The Pearl of the Mediterranean," Alexandria's atmosphere is more Mediterranean than Middle Eastern. Our first stop is the Fort at Quit Bay, followed by a visit to the ancient Catacombs of Kom and Pompay's Pillar. Before returning to Cairo, we will relax with the breathtaking views of the Montaza Palaces. Dinner and overnight in Cairo.

Day 4: Coptic Cairo, Hanging Church

We begin our sightseeing with a visit to the Hanging Church, the most famous Coptic church in Cairo. Named so as it was built over the Roman Gate of Babylon by the Nile River, this old city's section was definitely the route taken by Abraham, Joseph, Moses, and the family of Jesus.

Next, we visit the beautiful Alabaster Mosque of Muhammad Ali to better understand Muslim religious practices. Completed in 1848, the Ottoman-style Muhammad Ali Mosque is the most noticeable in all of Cairo. A stop will be made at the papyrus factory store, where we see the process of creating lovely Egyptian art pictures. Dinner and overnight in Cairo.

Day 5: Esna to Luxor, Karnak

This morning, we transfer to the airport for our flight to Luxor. Upon arrival in Luxor, we board our river cruise boat and have free time for lunch. This afternoon, we visit the Temple of Karnak and the East Bank of the Nile. We will also see the famous Temple of Luxor, founded during the reign of Amenhotep III, grandson of the Pharaoh of the Exodus. The grandeur of these temples, with their towering columns and intricate hieroglyphs, will leave you in awe. We re-board our ship for dinner and overnight.

Day 6: Valley of the Kings

Today, we visit the Valley of the Kings, where many ancient pharaohs were buried, and the famous Temple of Hatshepsut, the princess who perhaps pulled baby Moses out of the Nile River. This temple may have been designed by Moses. Explore the tombs of the pharaohs, decorated with vivid scenes from Egyptian mythology that tell the story of the journey to the afterlife. We have dinner and overnight on board.

Day 7: Kom Ombo, Edfu, Esna


Breakfast is served on board before we spend time touring Edfu, the location of one of the best-preserved Egyptian temples, dedicated to the falcon god Horus. This afternoon, we visit the remains of Kom Ombo Temple, situated on the riverside and dedicated to two gods: the crocodile god Sebek and the solar god Horus the Great. The duality of this temple reflects the balance of ancient Egyptian beliefs. We have dinner and overnight on board.

Day 8: Aswan, Optional Abu Simbel

While docked in Aswan, the morning is free to enjoy breakfast, relax on the sun deck, and shop along the waterfront. Alternatively, you may choose an early departure optional tour to Abu Simbel, part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site known as the "Nubian Monuments." Our Egyptologist guide will discuss the relevance of this spectacular site from Egyptian history. We visit the massive temple of Pharaoh Rameses II and the temple of Queen Nefertari, Rameses' most beloved wife.













This afternoon, we visit the High Dam and the Philae Temple on the Island of Philae, dedicated to the goddess Isis. Our sightseeing continues with a Felucca ride around the Agha Khan Mausoleum before returning for dinner and overnight on board.

Day 9: Memphis, Sakkara

This morning, we take a flight back to Cairo and then a short ride to Memphis, the legendary city of Menes, the King who united Upper and Lower Egypt. From a biblical perspective, Memphis is where Abraham lied to Pharaoh about his wife Sarah being his sister and where Joseph served as second in command. View a very large and well-preserved statue of Ramses II. Next is Sakkara, one of the most extensive archaeological sites in Egypt, dominated by the Step Pyramid of King Zoser, dating back to 2700 BC. We also visit Faiyum, the region created by the divinely inspired wisdom of Joseph, where we find ancient storehouses and a man-made lake. Dinner and overnight in Cairo.

Day 10: Cairo

Today allows for a full day of touring the wonders of the ancient world, some of which date back to 1000+ years prior to Abraham. We spend time at one of the seven wonders of the world, the pyramids. Cheops, with an original height of 496 feet, is the most colossal pyramid ever built. We will also see the Sphinx and tour the Egyptian Museum, location of Tutankhamen's treasures and ancient remains. The museum's vast collection includes artifacts spanning over 5,000 years of history, providing deep insights into ancient Egyptian civilization. Dinner and overnight in Cairo.

Day 11: Departure Home

After breakfast at the hotel, we head to Cairo Airport for our flight homeward, carrying cherished memories and a renewed faith from our journey through the ancient lands of Egypt.









EXODUS PILGRIMAGE

RETRACING THE STEPS OF THE ANCIENT ISRAELITES

14 Days / 12 Nights

Embark on a transformative journey retracing the ancient steps of the Israelites. This 14-day pilgrimage through Egypt, Jordan, and Israel offers a profound connection to biblical history, enriching your faith and understanding of the Exodus and other pivotal biblical events.

Day 1: Departure to Cairo

Our life-changing journey begins this evening as we board our overnight flight to Cairo, Egypt.

Day 2: Arrival in Cairo

Arrive at Cairo International Airport. After passport control, meet your tour representative and transfer to your hotel in Cairo. Enjoy dinner and rest for the evening, preparing for the adventures ahead.

Day 3: Pyramids of Giza

Begin your pilgrimage with a visit to the iconic Pyramids of Giza, one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World. Explore the Cheops Pyramid, the largest of the three, and marvel at the Sphinx. Experience a camel ride by the pyramids and visit the Papyrus Institute. In the afternoon, visit the Egyptian Museum to view antiquities from Egypt's Pharaonic period, including the treasures of King Tutankhamun. End the day at the medieval bazaars of Khan-El-Khalili. Dinner and overnight in Cairo.

Day 4: Luxor

Take an early flight to Luxor, the ancient capital of Egypt. Start your exploration with the spectacular Karnak Temple complex, dedicated to the Theban triad of Amun, Mut, and Khonsu. Walk along the Avenue of Sphinxes and explore the Precinct of Amon-Re, the largest religious building ever constructed. Visit the Luxor Temple, connected to Karnak by the Avenue of Sphinxes and known for its grandeur and historical significance.

Day 5: Valley of the Kings

Cross the Nile to the Valley of the Kings, the final resting place of Egypt's pharaohs. Explore one of the major tombs, such as that of Tutankhamun or Ramses VI, and admire the intricate wall paintings that depict the journey to the afterlife. Visit the Valley of the Queens, where the wives of the pharaohs were buried, including the famous tomb of Nefertari. Return to the airport for a flight back to Cairo. Dinner and overnight in Cairo.

Day 6: Sinai Excursion

Board a bus early in the morning for a drive to Sinai. Journey through the desert, recounting the Exodus story, and view the towering red-granite mountains, including Jebel Musa. Visit St. Catherine's Monastery, the oldest continuously inhabited Christian monastery, and marvel at its ancient library and the Burning Bush. Dinner and overnight at Morganland Village.

Day 7: Mt. Sinai

Begin with an optional sunrise ascent of Mount Sinai. Reach the peak to witness the sunrise and explore the traditional site of Moses' encounter with God. After descending, tour St. Catherine's Monastery. Travel to Nuweiba and embark on a fast ferry to Aqaba in Jordan. Meet the Jordanian guide and transfer to your hotel in Petra. Dinner and overnight in Petra.

Day 8: Petra

Spend the day touring Petra, one of the Seven Wonders of the World. Walk through the Siq to the Treasury and explore the tombs, burial chambers, and theater. Visit the Royal Tombs and the Byzantine church. After lunch, travel to Amman. Dinner and overnight in Amman.

Day 9: Mt. Nebo and the Holy Land

Leave Amman for Mount Nebo, where Moses viewed the Promised Land. Continue to Madaba to see the 6th-century mosaic floor map of the Holy Land. Descend to the Jordan Valley and cross the border into Israel. Visit ancient Jericho and view the mountain of Jesus' temptation. Travel through the Jordan Valley to Beth Shean. Explore the Roman ruins and continue north to the Sea of Galilee. Dinner and overnight at the Sea of Galilee.

Day 10: Sea of Galilee

Start the day with a visit to Capernaum, where Jesus performed many miracles and taught in the synagogue.













Continue to Tabgha, the site of the miracle of the loaves and fishes, and visit the Church of the Multiplication. Ascend the Mount of Beatitudes, where Jesus delivered the Sermon on the Mount. Follow an ancient trade route to Tel Dan and Caesarea Philippi, significant sites in Jesus' ministry. Drive over the Golan Heights, offering stunning views of the surrounding region. End the day with a peaceful boat ride on the Sea of Galilee, reflecting on the serene beauty of the area. Dinner and overnight at the Sea of Galilee.

Day 11: Journey to Jerusalem

Visit Nazareth, the childhood home of Jesus, and the Church of the Annunciation, believed to be the site where the Angel Gabriel announced the birth of Jesus to Mary. Explore Megiddo, an ancient city with layers of archaeological remains, and ascend Mt. Carmel, where Elijah challenged the prophets of Baal. Visit Caesarea Maritima, the ancient port city built by Herod the Great, and see the impressive remains of the Roman aqueduct and theater. Travel to Jerusalem. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 12: Mount of Olives and Bethlehem

Begin with an orientation from the Mount of Olives, offering a panoramic view of Jerusalem. Follow the Palm Sunday route to Dominus Flevit, where Jesus wept over the city, and then to the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus prayed before his arrest. Visit Peter in Gallicantu, where Peter denied Jesus three times, and Solomon's Pools, ancient reservoirs that supplied water to Jerusalem. Continue to Bethlehem to visit the Shepherds' Fields and the Church of the Nativity, the birthplace of Jesus. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 13: Dead Sea, Qumran, Masada

Visit the Shrine of the Book, home to the Dead Sea Scrolls, and see the model of ancient Jerusalem. Travel to Qumran, the site where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered, and view Cave #4. Continue to Masada, the fortress where Jewish rebels made their last stand against the Romans, and take a cable car to the top for breathtaking views. Conclude the day with a float in the buoyant waters of the Dead Sea, experiencing its unique mineral-rich properties. Return to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight.

Day 14: Old Jerusalem

Enter through the Dung Gate and examine the Ophel excavations, uncovering the ancient city of David.

Visit the Western Wall, the holiest site in Judaism, and see the Dome of the Rock and the Al-Aqsa Mosque on the Temple Mount. Explore the Pools of Bethesda, where Jesus healed a paralyzed man, and St. Anne's Church, known for its acoustics and beautiful architecture. Follow the Via Dolorosa, the path Jesus walked on his way to the crucifixion, leading to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, the traditional site of Jesus' crucifixion and burial. End the day at the Garden Tomb for a communion celebration, reflecting on the resurrection of Jesus. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 15: Departure

Depart Jerusalem for the airport in Tel Aviv for your flight home, reflecting on the enriching experiences and profound connections made throughout your pilgrimage.
